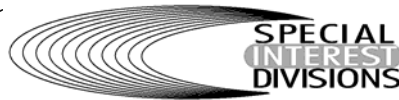

Parent Programs that Work! The efficacy of parent training for preschoolers with language disorders

Register early; space is limited!

The purpose of this workshop is to review evidence-based parent training programs that are naturalistic and facilitate communication skills in children with language disorders/ASD. A second purpose of this workshop is to describe the costs and benefits of mounting parent programs at a community level. Specific strategies taught to parents in *It Takes Two to Talk*® and *More Than Words*® will be demonstrated, analyzed, and discussed using videotaped examples. In addition, facilitating behavior change using principles of adult education within group training sessions and individual videotaping and feedback sessions will be presented. At the end of this workshop, which is directed to speech-language pathologists at an introductory level, participants will be able to: (a) describe responsive strategies that parents can use with young children to promote interaction and communication development, (b) state the essential components of service delivery to groups of parents that facilitate learning and behavior change (c) summarize the evidence supporting parent training for young children with communication and language disorders.
